Studies in the Surplus Approach

This new journal, which will be published twice a year, is devoted to advancing the task of theoretical reconstruction in political economy. We feel this is a necessary task today since the criticisms which have undermined the dominant theory (i.e. marginalism) have yet to develop into an equally comprehensive alternative.

Promising guidelines for this reconstruction are available in the approach to distribution and relative prices of the classical economists and of Marx, which has been brought back to light with Sraffa's edition of Ricardo's Works. This journal will seek to provide a meeting point for the necessary work of critical elaboration.

As an integral part of theoretical reconstruction Political Economy will endeavour to promote applied work both in interpreting economic experience and examining basic policy issues relating to capitalist and socialist, developed and less developed, countries.
